**Randolph S. "Randy" Carey Sr.**



Long time Denver resident Randy Carey, was born April 28, 1934 in Hutchinson, Kansas to the late Emerson Carey, Jr. and Margaret Slavens Carey. Randy was an insurance agent. Randy passed away on January 8, 2017 after a brief illness. Randy's family moved to Denver in 1939. He graduated from South High School and Williams College, where he was captain of the golf team. In 1954 he won the Colorado Amateur (CGA Stroke Play Championship) Golf Championship. He was a well-known golfer at the Denver, Olympia Fields (Chicago) and Essex County (New Jersey) country clubs, and had lifetime three holes in one. Randy served in the U.S. Army at Fort Bliss, Texas from 1956 through 1960. He was director of development in the 1970s at Kent School, and then became a long-time insurance agent for the Stailey Parker and Cowest insurance companies. Randy is survived by his wife of 30 years, Gini, sons, Merrick (Melissa) Carey, and Randy Carey, Jr., and step-children Anita, (Jim) Comisky, Susan (Buddy) Ducey, Phillip (Bonnie) Rosenthal, Cliff (Toni) Biggs, and Patrick Biggs; and ~12 grandchildren. Randy is survived by his sister, Anabel C. McHugh. His brother Emerson "Duke" Carey, pre-deceased him. Randy's sense of humor and storytelling are a lasting gift cherished by all. Randy was a Friend of Bill W. for over 36 years, a mentor and friend to many. Randy shared his passion of golf and will be remembered by his myriad of friends for his positive outlook on life.
