Charles William (Bill) Coldwell Niantic, CT Charles William (Bill) Coldwell, age 92, of Niantic, CT, passed away on October 19, 2018 at Lawrence and Memorial Hospital in New London, CT. Bill was born in New York City on May 10, 1926, the son of Everett S. and Charlotte Bates Coldwell. He married Phyllis E. Wilson of Norwich, CT on May 9, 1953, and they resided in Bronxville, NY; Chappaqua, NY, Mystic, CT and most recently in Niantic, CT. Bill was a WWII veteran serving in Korea. After the war he served as 1st Lt. commanding the 7th Infantry Division Palace Guard, posted to the US Soviet Commission that was to jointly govern Korea. He left Bronxville HS early at age seventeen to volunteer in the Army. He attended VMI, OCS, and, after military training, **Williams College**. He began his broadcasting career as a page with NBC and retired 37 years later as VP National Sales Manager of Seltel Inc., a TV station representative firm located in NYC. He is survived by his wife, Phyllis, his four sons, Jeffrey and his wife Susane, Charles Jr. and his wife Deborah, Scott and his husband Kevin, Mark and his wife Leann, eight grandchildren and two great-granddaughters. He was predeceased by his brother, Robert, on June 23, 2011. Bill was a 32 degree Mason and past Master of Gramatan Lodge in Bronxville. He served many years as a Deacon of the West Center Congregational Church of Bronxville, First Congregational Church of Chappaqua NY, and the Mystic Congregational Church 43 East Main St. Mystic where a memorial service will be held October 29, 2018 11:00 a.m. In addition, he spent many years as an active member of the Mystic Historic Commission and the Cable TV Advisory Commission.
