<p>Alvin Henry Hatch, 87, passed away on Feb. 24, 2015, after a period of failing health. He was born Dec. 10, 1927, in Malden, Massachusetts. He grew up on Marblehead Neck, Massachusetts and graduated from Williams College in 1950, after serving in the U.S. Army in occupied Japan. He earned his master's in math and physics from Northeastern University. Al worked on the early mainframe computers at IBM in New York City. In 1957, he moved to Reading, Massachusetts, and continued his career in computers at GTE/Sylvania and Raytheon. He retired to North Conway in 1985. He was very active in the Prospectors Ski Club in Kearsarge. He had a long and happy retirement, and was a volunteer with many local groups. He was the oldest EMT ever to join the North Conway Fire Department. He loved spending time on Mount Washington, where he was a Tip-Top House guide. He climbed all 48 of the 4,000 footers in the White Mountains. He married Lois Nelson in 1992, and Al and Lois lived in North Conway until he moved to Merriman House in January. Al was predeceased by his parents, Evelyn and Pryor Percival; his brother, Pryor "Bill" Percival Jr.; his first wife, Gretchen Baum Hatch; and good friend, Alvar Nelson. He is survived by his wife, Lois; his sister, Penny Moore and husband, Brad of Duncans Mills, California, and their family; his children, Elizabeth Gill of New Gloucester, Maine and Martha Leich and husband, Jeff, of North Conway, and Bob Nelson and Kerri McCauley of Conway. Poppa leaves four grandchildren: Devin Gill of Truckee, California, Katie Gill of Key West, Florida, and Alex Leich and Emily Leich of North Conway. He will also be missed by Olivia Marie. Al was a true gentleman and a gentle giant in every sense. He accepted everyone for who they were and never was judgmental. A loving soul, who, in his quiet way, left his everlasting mark on all those who had the honor of knowing him.
