Rufus (Ed) E. Jarman, Jr., member of the Williams College class of 1962, died at his home in Foster, Rhode Island on July 20th, 2018, after a long and courageous battle with cancer.

After Williams he earned an LLB degree in 1965 and an LLM degree in 1974, both from the School of Law at New York University. He worked for many years as a partner in the Manhattan law firm of Barnes, Richardson & Colburn, specializing in international trade and customs law. An experienced litigator before the international trade courts, Ed was a long-term board member and officer of the Customs and International Trade Bar Association, also serving as its president.

For several decades he lived in Cobble Hill, Brooklyn. In later years he retired to rural Rhode Island. He is survived by his two children, his son Baird E. Jarman (Williams '92), now of Northfield, MN, and his daughter Georgia H. Jarman, now of Atlanta, GA, the city of his birth.
