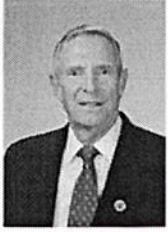

Edmond W. Miller



Oneida >> Edmond W. Miller, Jr., 85, died Friday, Aug. 4, 2017, at the Masonic Care Community in Utica, N.Y. where he received loving and compassionate care.

Born in Morristown, N.J. he was the son of the late Mabel and Edmond Miller, Sr. He was raised in Mountain Lakes, N.J. and was a 1954 graduate of Williams College where he was a member and President of Chi Psi fraternity. He earned a Master of Arts in Teaching from Cornell University and pursued additional graduate work at the University of Alaska, SUNY Albany, and Syracuse University.

Ed taught junior and senior high school Social Studies in Port Washington, N.Y. and North Colonie, N.Y. He retired from Vernon-Verona-Sherrill Central School District as an Administrator from 1968 to 1990. Following retirement, he was a Sales Associate for Kingsley Real Estate in Oneida. He was a veteran of the Korean War conflict serving in the US Air Force as an Officer with a tour in Fairbanks, Alaska.

Ed served two terms on the Oneida City Common Council and as Deputy Mayor. He then was elected to five terms on the Madison County Board of Supervisors where he was Chairman of the Criminal Justice Public Safety Committee, Chairman of the Indian Relations Committee and a member of the Alternatives to Incarceration Program for Madison County.

Dedicated to his community, Ed was devoted to local service organizations including the Oneida-Sherrill Lions Club, United Way Board of Directors, Oneida Housing Authority Board of Directors, Glenwood Cemetery Association Board of Directors and the Oneida Community Mansion House Board of Directors. Ed was humbled to be a recipient of the Oneida Rotary's "Roses to the Living" Award.

A long-standing member of St. John's Episcopal Church, Ed was a licensed lay eucharistic minister and served as Warden and Vestry member.

Ed was a tireless sports fan and participant. He was devoted to Oneida and VVS school district sports, attending hundreds of events in his lifetime in support of the young people he loved. He cheered for Syracuse University football, basketball and lacrosse. Ed played tennis competitively, enjoyed golf, skiing and loved playing pool with his buddies.

Ed is survived by his true love, Susanne (Sue) and two daughters and their husbands, Deborah and Michael Misenhimer and Michelle and John Carpenter. His beloved son, Edmond W. Miller III, and his brother, Robert W. Miller pre-deceased him.

Ed is also survived by seven grandchildren whom he adored: Andrea Colegrove (Sam Ahonen), Edmond Colegrove (Lauren), Matthew Carpenter (Danielle), Peter Carpenter (Kirsten Newton), Sarah Clermont (Aaron), Myleah Misenhimer (Brent Frary) and Mikayla Pecan (Dan).

His dear sisters-in-law Jane Miller and Andrea Sullivan, two nieces, two nephews and six great grand children also survive him.
