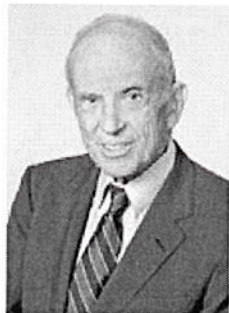

In Memoriam – Fredric S. Nathan

Fred Nathan, a partner in the firm's Private Clients practice, died on March 14 after a lengthy illness. At Kelley Dye, he focused on trusts and estates and litigation matters. Mr. Nathan joined the firm in 1982.

A World War II veteran, Mr. Nathan attended law school at Yale upon returning from Europe. Prior to joining Kelley Dye, he served as first assistant corporate counsel for the City of New York under Mayor Lindsay (1966-1969) and an Assistant U.S. Attorney for the Southern District of New York from 1953-1956. Mr. Nathan was a member of the New York State Bar. In 1948, he received a J.D. from Yale Law School. In 1943, he graduated from Williams College cum laude with a B.A.

Mr. Nathan was an active philanthropist who was involved in numerous Jewish, educational and literacy organizations throughout his life. He was a trustee and former chair of the Mount Sinai Hospital and Mount Sinai School of Medicine Legal Committee since 1970. Mr. Nathan was vice president of the American Jewish Society for Service from 1951-2007 and remained a board member until his death. He was a board member and former secretary of Read Ahead, formerly the Everybody Wins! Foundation. Mr. Nathan also served as a director and board member of FOJP Services Corp., a subsidiary of the Federation of Jewish Philanthropies.

Among the honors bestowed upon Mr. Nathan were the United Hospital Fund "Trustee of the Year" award in 2012 and the Whitney North Seymour Award for Public Service by the Federal Bar Council in 2003.
