Lucy B. Pinkerton, 93, died on Sept. 15, 2017, at Gosnell Memorial Hospice House in Scarborough following a short battle with ovarian cancer. Lucy was born in Williamstown, Mass. to Rueben and Bertha Blatchford. She attended North Adams Community College and Bennington. She met her husband Charlie on his return from World War II to Williams College and they married in 1949.

Lucy and Charlie settled in Norwalk, Conn. to raise their family of three children and many cats and dogs.

Lucy was active in the Norwalk Historical Society and succeeded, with other preservationists, in the designation of Lockwood Mathews Mansion as a National Historic Landmark in 1971. Lucy was an avid gardener and nature lover. She spent many summer days by Squam Lake in New Hampshire. She accompanied her husband on business trips around the US and abroad for International Paper Co. Lucy and Charlie moved to Kennebunk in 2013. She was predeceased by her husband of 65 years, Charles Pinkerton, Jr. and her sister Rosalie Newkom. Survivors include Sarah Pinkerton and her husband Paul Bonneau of Cape Porpoise, Charles Pinkerton, III and Anne H. Pinkerton both of Kennebunk, her brother-in-law Peyton R.H.
