

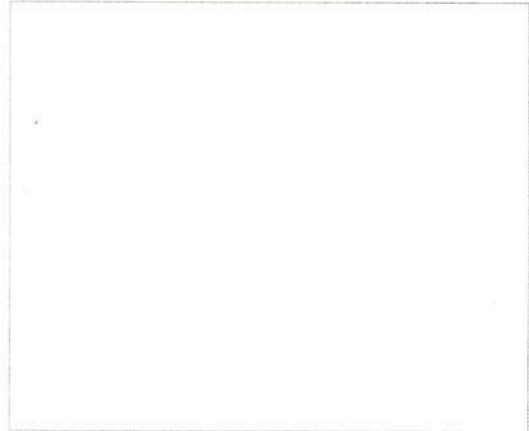

Sharon McCullough Tucker, The world lost a true sports fan on Wednesday, Jan. 2, 2019, when Sharon Tucker peacefully passed away from heart failure at the age of 67.
